

FOREWORD

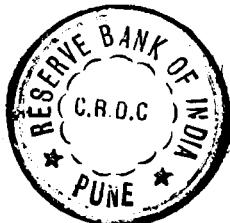

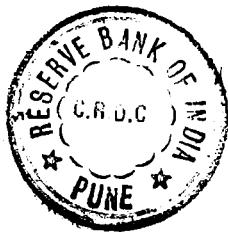

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NOTES ON THE STATEMENTS

In the Statistical Statements presented in this volume, annual data are generally given for the financial years 1965-66 and 1969-70 to 1975-76 ; thus the data for 1975-76 refer to the year from April 1, 1975 to March 31, 1976. However, the statements on Industrial Production and Capital raised by Non-Government and Government Companies are presented on calendar year basis, as the statistics compiled by the respective sources are on that basis. Further, data relating to (i) Agricultural Production, (ii) Financial Assistance Sanctioned by the Industrial Finance Corporation of India, (iii) Industrial Development Bank of India, (iv) Agricultural Refinance and Development Corporation, (v) Unit Trust of India, (vi) Consumer Price Index Numbers for Agricultural Labourers and (vii) Credit Guarantee Scheme for Small-Scale Industries are for the year ended June.

The statements newly included are (i) Financial Flows—Government Sector : 1972-73, (ii) Consumer Price Index Numbers for Agricultural Labourers, (iii) Deposit Insurance Corporation—Coverage of Deposit Insurance and (iv) Net Issue (+)/Withdrawal (—) of Small Coins—By Centres.

The Indian Rupee was devalued on June 6, 1966 changing its par value from Rs. 4.76 per U.S. Dollar to Rs. 7.50 per U.S. Dollar and from Rs. 13.33 per Pound Sterling to Rs. 21.00 per Pound Sterling. On devaluation of the Pound Sterling on November 18, 1971, the exchange value of the rupee in terms of Sterling changed to Rs. 18.00 per Pound Sterling. On December 20, 1971, India established a central rate for the rupee at Rs. 18.9677 per Pound Sterling. Effective September 25, 1975, the exchange rate of the rupee is determined on the basis of a basket of currencies of countries which are India's major trading partners, severing the earlier link with the Pound Sterling which still continues to remain India's intervention currency. Accordingly, the following revisions were effected in the rupee's exchange rate *vis-a-vis* the Pound Sterling.

From November 1, 1956 (on which date the States Reorganisation Act, 1956, became effective) to April 30, 1960, the Indian Union consisted of fourteen states and a few centrally administered areas. The erstwhile Bombay State was bifurcated on May 1, 1960, into (i) Maharashtra and (ii) Gujarat. On December 1, 1963, Nagaland was constituted as a new State and on November 1, 1966, another new State *viz.*, Haryana was formed. On April 2, 1970, State of Meghalaya was constituted ; till then it formed a part of the State of Assam. On January 25, 1971, Himachal Pradesh and on January 21, 1972, two new States of Manipur and Tripura came into existence. The Adaption of Sikkim Laws (No. 1) Order, 1975 came into force with effect from April 26, 1975. At present the number of States in Indian Union is twenty-two. The Federal Government is the Government of India, also called the Central Government.

Wherever necessary, each figure has been rounded off to the nearest final digit. For this reason, in some statements the constituent items may not exactly add up to the total.

The following symbols have been used :

- .. = Figure is not available.
- = Figure is nil or negligible.

A line drawn between the figures of two consecutive rows/columns indicates that the figures given after the line are not comparable with the preceding figures.

1 lakh=100,000 ; 10 lakhs=1 million and 1 crore=10 millions.

The statistical data presented in the statements have been supplemented, wherever necessary, with suitable foot-notes to explain the limitations, coverage, etc. In addition, detailed explanatory notes on certain statements are given below :

Statement 20 :

For 1965-66 and 1969-70, the figures relating to gold are inclusive of gold received against National Defence Fund and National Defence Gold Bonds, 1980. For 1965-66, the figures also include gold received against 7 per cent Gold Bonds, 1977 and 1980. From 1970-71 to 1974-75 the figures are inclusive of gold from following gold accounts : Surplus Gold Stock Account, Gold held at I.M.F. rate (confiscated gold received from State Governments, etc.), Confiscated gold received from Customs and Central Excise authorities, National Defence Fund Gold Stock Account, Indian (Bharat) Mines Gold Stock Account, Reserve Bank of India (Issue Department) Gold Stock Account, Gold received from Hutt Gold Mines and Gold received from public for refining. 1975-76 data pertain to Surplus Gold Stock (Amalgamated) Account, Confiscated Gold Stock Account (received from Customs and Central Excise authorities), Reserve Bank of India (Issue Department) Gold Stock Account and Gold received from Hutt Gold Mines and public for refining.

The figures of Silver melting and assaying are inclusive of Silver from Surplus Silver Stock Account, Confiscated Silver received from the Customs and Central Excise authorities, Silver received from State Governments and Judicial authorities, Silver pertaining to the National Defence Fund and Silver received from private parties, etc.

Statement 29 :

The item 'Other liabilities' includes :

i) paid-up capital of Rs. 5 crores, and
ii) reserve fund of Rs. 80 crores upto January 31, 1969 and Rs. 150 crores thereafter, the increase representing mainly the profit on revaluation of the Bank's gold stocks, effected from February 1, 1969 in terms of the amendment to Section 33(4) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934. Also included in

'Other liabilities' are the balances as on various dates in (a) National Agricultural Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund [N.A.C. (L.T.O.) Fund], (b) National Agricultural Credit (Stabilisation) Fund [N.A.C. (Stab.) Fund] and (c) National Industrial Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund [N.I.C. (L.T.O.) Fund], the details of which are given below :

Statement 31 :

Consequent on the merger of the Refinance Corporation for Industry with Industrial Development Bank of India from September 1, 1964, the shares of the paid-up value of Rs. 100 lakhs, held by the Reserve Bank of India, have been paid for and taken up by the Industrial Development Bank of India.

Outstandings in respect of short-term finance to Industrial Finance Corporation under Section 17(4B)(a) and to Industrial Development Bank of India under Section 17 (4H)(a) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 are 'nil'. Consequent upon the coming into force of the Public Financial Institutions (Amendment) Act, 1975 from February 16, 1976, share holdings of the Reserve Bank of India in all the SFCs and IDBI have been transferred and vested in IDBI and Government of India respectively from that date.

Statement 39 :

(a) The Reserve Bank of India Rate(Bank Rate) was raised from 4 per cent to 4.5 per cent on January 3, 1963, to 5 per cent on September 26, 1964, to 6 per cent on February 17, 1965, was lowered to 5 per cent on March 3, 1968, was raised to 6 per cent from January 9, 1971, to 7 per cent on May 31, 1973 and to 9 per cent from July 23, 1974.

(b) Treasury bill rate of discount for sales on tap was 3.50 per cent per annum from July 16, 1965 to March 2, 1968. It was lowered to 3.00 per cent from March 4, 1968, raised to 3.50 per cent from January 9, 1971, to 4.00 per cent from June 1, 1973, to 4.25 per cent from April 1, 1974 and to 4.60 per cent from July 23, 1974.

(c) (i) The call money rates are the weighted averages of the quotations, the weights being proportional to the amounts accepted during the period. (ii) As a follow up of the Reserve Bank's decision to fix the maximum lending rate charged by commercial banks at 16.5 per cent effective March 15, 1976, the Indian Banks Association issued a directive to its members asking them not to demand or pay more than 12.5 per cent per annum on any inter-bank borrowing with effect from March 29, 1976.

(d) The Bazar bill rate is the rate at which bills of small traders are reported to have been discounted by Shroffs. These are unofficial quotations.

(e) Deposits rates are for major banks having demand and time liabilities of Rs. 50 crores and above and for foreign banks. These rates were based on Inter-Bank Agreement upto September 1964 and on the Reserve Bank directives thereafter.

(f) With effect from February 1, 1975, the smaller banks with aggregate demand and time liabilities of less than Rs. 25 crores are allowed to pay 0.25 per cent higher on their term deposits with maturity of 5 years and less. For savings deposits, the rate will be 5.25 per cent for banks with liabilities of Rs. 10—25 crores and 5.50 per cent for banks with liabilities of less than Rs. 10 crores.

(g) A ceiling of 9 per cent was imposed on the lending rates of the Indian scheduled banks with aggregate demand and time liabilities of Rs. 50 crores or above and all the foreign scheduled banks with effect from September 25, 1964 ; the rate was raised to 10 per cent from February 17, 1965, but reduced to 9.50 per cent from March 2, 1968. Since January 21, 1970, the ceiling on the lending rates was withdrawn.

(h) With effect from March 15. 1976, the Bank fixed the maximum lending rate to be charged by scheduled commercial banks having demand and time liabilities of over Rs. 50 crores at 16.5 per cent. Banks with demand and time liabilities between Rs. 25 crores and Rs. 50 crores will be allowed to charge one percentage point higher than the ceiling rate of interest (i.e 17.5 per cent). The rate is inclusive of the 7 per cent levy on interest income from advances. The ceiling rate will not apply to banks with demand and time liabilities of less than Rs. 25 crores.

Statement 42 :

Under the Credit Guarantee Scheme, which is administered by the Reserve Bank of India as an agent of the Central Government, all receipts by way of guarantee fees, recoveries in claim paid accounts, etc. less all payments by way of claims are transmitted to Government as at the end of June and December each year. The net surplus with the Government represents the net amount (cumulative) transferred to Government. The entire administrative expenditure of the Guarantee Organisation is borne by the Reserve Bank of India.

Under the Scheme, as modified from February 1, 1970 (when the number of Guarantees outstanding was 92,755) and in terms of the agreement between the bank/financial institution and the Guarantee Organisation, all eligible credit facilities to small-scale units are deemed as covered and the issue of Guarantee certificates in respect of individual credit facilities having been dispensed with, they are required to file quarterly returns reporting such eligible credit facilities.

Advances under Default

As soon as a default occurs in an account, the credit institution is required to report it to the Guarantee Organisation and the guarantee may be invoked any time thereafter. Such accounts, therefore, are potential claims.

Statement 44 :

Debt : Comprises (1) all borrowings from Government and semi-Government, Statutory Financial Corporations and other institutional agencies, (2) borrowings from banks against (i) other mortgages and (ii) own debentures for 1650 companies and (3) "Other borrowings" against (i) own debentures, (ii) other mortgages, (iii) deferred payment liabilities and (iv) public and other deposits for 1650 companies.

Equity is the same as *Net worth*, explained in the Statement.

Current assets : Comprise (1) inventories, (2) loans and advances and other debtor balances, (3) investments in securities other than shares and debentures of subsidiary companies for 1501 companies/book value of quoted investments for 1650 companies, (4) cash and bank balances and (5) advance of income-tax in excess of tax-provision.

Current liabilities : Comprise (1) tax provisions in excess of advance of income-tax and other current provisions, (2) borrowings less debt as defined above and (3) trade dues and other current liabilities.

Statements 65 to 67 :

Figures for Revenue and Capital accounts given in Statements 65 to 67 are not comparable with those given in the Reports on Currency and Finance published prior to 1973-74 due to changes in the accounting classification of the Budget. Please refer to Chapter V on "Budgets and Public Debt" of the Report on Currency and Finance for 1973-74 for a brief discussion on the new classification.

Statement 67 :

The figures of total revenue and expenditure as given in this statement differ from those

in the Budget papers because (a) receipts from forests, opium, currency and mint, electricity, etc., are shown on a net basis and (b) States' share of Union excise duties and additional duties of excise are excluded. Budget estimates for 1976-77 relate to those presented to the Lok Sabha.

Data for 1973-74 onwards cover expenditure on food subsidy, famine relief and natural calamities under the head "Agriculture and allied services" as part of economic services under developmental expenditure ; in earlier data this expenditure is included under the head "other expenditure" as part of non-developmental expenditure.

Statement 74 :

Outstanding balances of debt and other liabilities of the Government of India as presented in this Statement differ from those published in the Bank's Reports on Currency & Finance prior to 1974-75. The difference reflects partly changes in the sources of data, but mainly the inclusion of some heads in the Statement which were not covered earlier.

Statements published in earlier Reports were compiled from three sources, viz., Finance Accounts of the Union Government, Combined Finance and Revenue Accounts of the Union and State Governments, and the Explanatory Memoranda on the Budgets of the Central Government. The data given in the present Statement are drawn from the Finance Accounts of the Union Government, except for the data for end-March 1976 and 1977 which are drawn from the Explanatory Memorandum on the Budget of the Central Government for 1976-77 because the Finance Accounts are not yet available for the last two years.

The main difference between the present Statement and the Statements prior to 1974-75 pertains to 'Reserve Funds and Deposits', outstanding balances against which are uniformly higher than the corresponding balances in the earlier Statements. This is largely due to the inclusion under this item in the present Statement of balances at credit of Reserve Funds not bearing interest ; these balances were not covered earlier.

Statement 75 :

The statement is prepared from the information given in the Explanatory Memorandum on the Central Government Budget. In the memoranda on Central Budgets prior to 1976-77, data on certain items like capital outlay on important departmental undertakings and investment in major autonomous corporations were separately shown and data on "External Debt" were shown country-wise and institution-wise, whereas in the Memorandum on the Central Budget for the year 1976-77 data on these items have been clubbed together and not given separately by corporation/institution/or country division.

Statement 76 :

The statement excludes :

(i) for 1965-66 and 1966-67, the contribution in respect of the National Defence Gold Bonds, 1980 (A and B Series) (the contribution to these bonds which were on sale between October 1965 and May 1966 were received in the form of gold),

(ii) 4½ per cent Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds 1979, 5½ per cent Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds 1999 and 4½ per cent Jayanti Shipping Company (Acquisition of Shares) Compensation Bonds 1981,

(iii) issues and repayments of : 2½ per cent U.P. Zamindari Abolition Compensation Bonds, U.P. Zamindari Abolition Rehabilitation Grant Bonds, 2½ per cent Rajasthan Jagir Resumption Compensation and Rehabilitation Bonds, 2½ per cent Rajasthan Zamindari and Biswedari Abolition Compensation Bonds, 2½ per cent Rajasthan Jagir Resumption Compensation and Additional Rehabilitation Bonds, 2½ per cent Bihar Zamindari Abolition Compensation Bonds, West Bengal Estates Acquisition Compensation Bonds, 3 per cent Maharashtra Agricultural Land (Ceiling on Holdings) Act, 1961, Compensation Bonds (Repayable in Instalments), Jenmikaram Payment (Abolition) Bonds, 3 per cent Bombay Land Tenure Abolition Acts, Compensation Bonds (Government of former Bombay, Maharashtra, Gujarat and

Mysore), Tamil Nadu Land Reforms (Fixation of Ceiling on Land) Act, 1961 Compensation Bonds, 3 per cent Maharashtra Revenue Patels (Abolition of Office) Act, 1962 Compensation Bonds, 4½ per cent Kerala House Sites and Houses for Families of Landless Workers (Compensation for value of lands) Bonds and 4½ per cent Kerala House Sites and Houses for Families of Landless Workers (Compensation for value of lands) Bonds,

and only issues of : 3 per cent Maharashtra Agricultural Land (Ceiling on Holdings) Act, 1961 Compensation Bonds (Redeemable on maturity), Assam State Acquisition of Zamindari Act, 1951 Compensation Bonds, 2¾ per cent Mysore Inams Abolition Compensation Bonds,

and only repayments of : 3½ per cent U.P. Encumbered Estates Act Bonds and 3 per cent Hyderabad (Abolition of Cash Grants) Act, 1952 Compensation Bonds.

During 1975-76, the total issues and repayments of these bonds amounted to Rs. 328 lakhs and Rs. 719 lakhs respectively.

(iv) Rs. 100 crores of *ad hoc* Treasury Bills funded in January 1976 and

(v) repayments of 3½ per cent Ten-Year Treasury Savings Deposit Certificates, 4 per cent Ten-Year Treasury Savings Deposit Certificates, 4½ per cent Ten-Year Defence Deposit Certificates, 15-Year Annuity Certificates-second series, Premium Prize Bonds, 1963, 5-Year Interest free Prize Bonds, 1965, Premium Prize Bonds, 1964 and Government of India Defence Certificates amounting to Rs. 1356 lakhs during 1975-76.

Statement 78 :

This statement on Government of India Loans also includes (i) Hyderabad Loans upto 1974, (ii) Premium Prize Bonds, 1963 (issued from January 1963) upto 1968 and Premium Prize Bonds, 1964 (issued from January 1964) upto 1969, (iii) 7 per cent (6½ per cent prior to April 1, 1965) Gold Bonds, 1977 issued from November 12, 1962, (iv) 7 per cent Gold Bonds, 1980 issued from March 2, 1965, (v) National Defence Gold Bonds, 1980 (A and B series) from 1967-68, the total contributions

being 82,35,209 gms. and 47,47,914 gms. respectively of gold for the two series. The value of these amounts to Rs. 441 lakhs and Rs. 254 lakhs, respectively, at the rate of Rs. 53.58 per 10 gms., (vi) 4½ per cent Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds, 1979 5½ per cent Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds, 1999 and 4½ per cent Jayanti Shipping Company (Acquisition of Shares) Compensation Bonds, 1981 and (vii) 5¾ per cent Bonds, 1985 (Voluntary Disclosure of Income and Wealth Ordinance, 1975).

Statement 79 :

State debt has been re-classified as recommended in the Second Report of the Team on Reforms in the Structure of Budget and Accounts. Outstanding debt liabilities from March 31, 1973 onwards presented in this Statement are, therefore, not strictly comparable, item by item, with those for the earlier period. Earlier the total debt of State Governments used to be shown under the following heads : (i) Permanent Debt, (ii) Floating Debt, (iii) Loans from the Centre, (iv) Other Debt and (v) Unfunded Debt. Under the new classification the major heads are : (i) Internal Debt, (ii) Loans and Advances from the Central Government and (iii) Provident Funds, etc.

I(a) Market loans and bonds : This item is identical with the item 'Permanent Debt' in the old classification, and comprises current and expired loans floated on the market and bonds issued in connection with abolition of Zamindari and Jagirdari and housing bonds, etc.

I(b) Ways and Means Advances from the Reserve Bank of India : This item corresponds to 'Floating Debt' of the earlier classification except for the exclusion of cash credits from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks, and represents in the new classification ways and means advances, and overdrafts (repayable within seven days) from the Reserve Bank of India. Figures in the Statement against this item upto March 31, 1972 represent outstanding 'Floating Debt' of the old classification and are thus not strictly comparable with those for the subsequent period.

I(c) Loans from Banks and Other Institutions : This item corresponds to 'Other Debt' of the earlier classification, but includes cash credits from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks not covered in 'Other Debt', and represents loans from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks, National Agricultural Credit (Long-term Operations) Fund of the Reserve Bank of India, National Co-operative Development Corporation, Life Insurance Corporation of India, Employees' State Insurance Corporation, Khadi and Village Industries Commission, etc. Figures against this item upto March 31, 1972 represent outstanding 'Other Debt' under the old classification and are, therefore, not strictly comparable with those for the subsequent period.

II. Loans and Advances from the Central Government : This item is identical with 'Loans from the Centre' in the earlier classification, and comprises loans and advances from the Central Government for plan as well as non-plan purposes including loans against small savings collections.

III. Provident Funds, etc : This item is identical with 'Unfunded Debt' of the old classification and includes State Provident Funds, Insurance and Pension Funds, Trusts and Endowments, etc.

Statement 81 :

The data for 1974 are compiled from the survey of ownership pattern of the rupee debt of Central and State Government securities which survey was conducted on an annual basis till 1971 and has now been placed on an *ad hoc* basis. The data for 1972 and 1973 are drawn from the following sources : (a) Reserve Bank records for holdings of the State Governments, and of the Reserve Bank of India on its own account ; (b) returns filed by commercial banks with the Economic Department for holdings of commercial banks; and (c) annual reports of Life Insurance Corporation of India, Coal Mines Provident Fund, Assam Tea Plantations Provident Fund and Employees' Provident Fund for their respective holdings.

Statement 82 :

(1) *Outstandings* include Indian Union's Share of pre-partition liabilities and Repayments include those from the pre-partition holdings of Indian investors.

(2) Some details of 'Uncurrent series' are given below :

5-Year Fixed Deposits :

This scheme, introduced from March 15, 1968, has been discontinued since August 1, 1971. The figures exclude outstandings in respect of '5-year Fixed Deposits—Banks' for which data are not available from September 1971 onwards.

15-Year Annuity Certificates :

The data relate to 'First series' issued from July 1954 to December 1957 and to 'Second series' issued from January 1958. The Certificates securing monthly payment of Rs. 10 were introduced from January 2, 1960. The series have been discontinued from September 1, 1971. Outstandings include all the series.

Post Office Cash and Defence Savings Certificates :

Include Defence Savings Bank Deposits upto 1954-55.

12-Year and 7-Year National Savings Certificates :

Discontinued with effect from May 30, 1957.

5-Year National Savings Certificates :

Discontinued with effect from July 1, 1953.

 $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent 10-Year Treasury Savings Deposit Certificates :

Issued from February 1, 1951 to May 31, 1957.

4 per cent 10-Year Treasury Savings Deposit Certificates :

Issued from June 1, 1957 and discontinued from November 10, 1962.

10-Year National Plan Certificates :

Issued from May 10, 1954 to May 30, 1957.

12-Year National Plan Savings Certificates :

Issued from June 1, 1957 and discontinued from November 15, 1962.

Statements 86 to 92 :

The foreign trade data relate to total sea, air and land trade, on private and Government accounts. With effect from April 1963, trade of Goa, Daman and Diu as well as Andaman and Nicobar Islands, land-borne trade with Nepal and exports by parcel-post of pearls and precious stones are included. Direct transit trade, transhipment trade, ships' stores and passengers' baggage are excluded. Data include silver (other than current coins) notes and coins withdrawn from circulation or not yet issued, indirect transit trade and trade by parcel-post. Exports include re-exports and exports by letter-post. Imports include dutiable articles by letter-post and defence stores and exclude certain consignments of foodgrains and stores on Government account awaiting adjustment. Imports and Exports are based on general system of recording ; imports are on c.i.f. basis and exports on f.o.b. basis inclusive of export duty. Indian rupee was devalued on June 6, 1966. Data from June 1966 onwards are not comparable with those for the earlier period. The exports figures for the period November 1970 to March 1973 are based on original copy of the shipping bills whereas the figures for the rest of the period are based on the finally passed shipping bills.

Total figures shown in statements 86, 87, 88 and 89 take into account recent revisions for which detailed breakdowns are not available. Revisions in the total figures are carried out by D.G.C.I. & S. as and when further details become available. Commodity-wise totals in statement 92 may not agree with corresponding figures in statement 87 as the latter are revised subsequently. From April 1965, data are based on the Revised Indian Trade Classification (with amendments upto April 1972) except in the case of imports of (i) "Prescribed substances" under the Atomic Energy Act, 1962 and (ii) "Petroleum and Petroleum Products".
