



#### INTRODUCTORY NOTE

The statistical information presented in this volume by and large relates to the financial year (April-March) except where otherwise specified. The presentation of data commences with the year 1970-71 in most of the statements. Data for the year 1975-76 have been retained since it is the mid-year of the decade 1970-80. In respect of a number of indicators the base year has been shifted to 1980-81 by the compiling agencies and hence presentation of data commences from this year. In view of the constraint of space, data for 1982-83 and 1983-84 have been dropped in some statements.

In the case of Statement No. 3 (National Income and Allied Indicators) as the Central Statistical Organisation (CSO) has revised the base year of National Accounts Statistics (NAS) from 1970-71 to 1980-81, the data on NAS are presented on the basis of the new series at 1980-81 prices. Consequently data for the years 1970-71 and 1975-76 have been dropped in this statement. Similarly data for these years have also been dropped from Statement No. 4 (Gross Domestic Product and Expenditure), Statement No. 5 (Net Domestic Product at Factor Cost by Industry of Origin) and Statement No. 11 (Share of Public Sector in Domestic Product).

In the case of Statement No. 18 (Index Numbers of Industrial Production) and 19 (Index Numbers of Industrial Production—Use-Based Classification), the CSO has shifted the base year from 1970 = 100 to 1980-81 = 100. Therefore, data for the years 1971 and 1976 are dropped from these 2 statements.

Further, in Statement No. 18, data in respect of 6 columns under 'Input based Classification' and 'Sectoral Indicators' are not available. Therefore, these have been substituted by Use-based classification by major groups only. As Index Numbers of Industrial Production in respect of individual industries under Use-based classification are not available for Statement No. 19, this information has been substituted by Index Numbers of Industrial Production of 17 industry groups in the manufacturing sector. In Statement No. 20 which presents data on Industrial Production in physical quantity and value, the coverage of industries has

been enlarged to 53 from 36. Data for the years 1970 and 1975 are dropped in view of the shifting of the base year. All the 3 statements referred to above are presented in this year's Report on a financial year basis.

Five new statements are introduced in this year's Report. These are: (1) 'Guarantee Cover Provided to SSI Units and Claims Preferred-Region-wise' (Statement No. 77), (2) 'Economiccum-Functional Classification of Total Expenditure of the Government of India' (Statement No. 84), (3) 'Financial Assistance to States and Union Territories-Functional Classification' (Statement No. 85), (4) 'Mintage of Commemorative Coins (For General Circulation)' (Statement No. 134) and (5) 'Mintage of Uncirculated/Proof Coins' (Statement No. 135). Following the introduction of the above five new statements, total number of statements in this Report has gone up to 135. This has necessitated renumbering of statements commencing from Statement No. 77.

Statement No. 21 i.e. Index Numbers of Wholesale Prices—By Groups and Sub-Groups which covered annual data and monthly data (for the latest year) together has been split in this Report into Statement No. 21-A and Statement No. 21-B. Statement No. 21-A presents data on an annual basis only with percentage variations. Statement No. 21-B presents data on a monthly basis only.

As regards Statement No. 33 (Short, Medium and Long-Term Advances of the Reserve Bank of India and NABARD to State-Co-operative Banks and Land Development Banks), note items 1 and 2 have been shifted to the section on 'Notes on the Statements'.

Statement No. 52 has been renamed as 'Credit Guarantee Scheme for Small Scale Industries and Small Borrowers' due to coverage of additional information relating to small borrowers. Statement No. 53 has also been renamed as 'Credit Guarantee Scheme Relating to Small Borrowers-Sector-wise Claims Received'. The title of Statement No. 56 has been changed to 'Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee

Corporation—Extent of Protection given to Depositors'.

Statistics in respect of the following statements are presented on a calendar year basis since the source agencies compile such statistics on calendar year basis. These are: (i) Estimated Employment In Public and Private Sectors (Statement No. 12), (ii) Employment in Public and Private Sectors in Major Industries and Services (Statement No. 13), (iii) Number of Applicants on Live Register of Employment Exchanges (Statement No. 14), (iv) Domestic Production and Imports (Gross) of Crude Oil and Petroleum Products (Statement No. 17), (v) Scheduled Commercial Banks' Advances to Agriculture (Statement No. 39), (vi) Scheduled Commercial Banks' Advances (a) to Small-Scale Industries, (b) to Small Road and Water Transport Operators and (c) for setting up of Industrial Estates (Statement No. 40), (vii) Regional Rural Banks—Number of Branches, Deposits, Outstandings and Overdues (Statement No. 45), (viii) Credit Guarantee Scheme for Small-Scale Industries and Small Borrowers (Statement No. 52), (ix) Credit Guarantee Schemes Relating to Small Borrowers -Sector-wise Claims Received (Statement No. 53), (x) Export Import Bank of India-Liabilities and Assets (Statement No. 66), (xi) Guarantee Cover Provided to SSI Units and Claims Preferred—Region-wise (Statement No. 77) and (xii) Note Forgeries (Statement No. 128). Effective September 25, 1975, the exchange rate of Rupee is determined on the basis of a basket of currencies of countries which are India's major trading partners, severing the earlier link with the pound sterling which, however, continues to remain India's intervention currency. In view of sharp fluctuations in foreign currency markets, the permissible margin for the variation in the value of Rupee was widened from 2.25 per cent on either side to 5 per cent with effect from January 30, 1979. The revisions effected in the Rupee's exchange rate vis-a-vis the pound sterling are given in a separate Statement No. 121 in this volume.

Explanatory notes in respect of certain statements are given at the end of this volume under 'Notes on the Statements'. Wherever necessary, the figures have been rounded off to the nearest full digit in the statement. For this reason, the constituent items may not necessarily add up to the total.

A line drawn between two consecutive rows/ columns indicates that the figures given after the line are not comparable with those preceding it.

#### Statement 11:

Administrative departments comprise all governmental agencies whether Central, State or Local.

Departmental enterprises are unincorporated enterprises. These comprise posts, telecommunications, railways, irrigation and multipurpose river schemes, electricity schemes, port trusts, road transport undertakings, etc.

Non-departmental enterprises comprise (i) government companies and (ii) statutory corporations.

#### Statement 14:

The statistics relating to University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau (UEIGB) in Delhi for all the years are included in the table. Statistics relating to UEIGBs in Maharashtra w.e.f. 1976, in Gujarat and Punjab w.e.f. 1980 and in all the States/Union Territories except in Bihar, Haryana, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh and Union Territory of Chandigarh, w.e.f. 1982 are also included in this Statement. However, statistics in regard to UEIGB in Tamil Nadu are excluded w.e.f. June 1, 1983.

Number of registrations represents the total number of job seekers who got their particulars registered for employment assistance at the various employment exchanges during the year.

Placements represent the number of registrants who are known to have secured employment during the year through sponsoring by the employment exchanges. Only those applicants in respect of whom adequate proof of having been placed in the employment is available, are accounted for.

Number of persons on live register represents the cumulative number of applicants who remain on the registers of employment exchanges as needing employment assistance at the end of the year.

#### Statement 26:

The demand and time components of savings deposits with scheduled commercial banks included in demand and time deposits in this Statement have undergone changes over the years.

Prior to March 1978, banks determined, while reporting the data to the Reserve Bank, demand component of savings deposits on the basis of the maximum amount a depositor could withdraw. There was, thus, no uniformity of classification. Banks were advised in October 1977 to follow a uniform practice viz., that the average monthly minimum balances arrived at for crediting interest should be treated as time liabilities and the rest as demand liabilities. Various banks adopted this new procedure of classification on different dates upto January 1981. Data for the period March 1978 to January 1981 were, therefore, reworked in the Reserve Bank on a uniform basis of classification. Data from February 1981 onwards are as reported by banks after classifying the demand and time components as per RBI guidelines.

£ National Rural Credit (Stabilisation) Fu<sup>-</sup>.d and National Rural Credit (LTO) Fund were earlier designated as National Agricultural Credit (Stabilisation) Fund and National Agricultural Credit (LTO) Fund, respectively and were maintained by the Reserve Bank of India prior to the formation of NABARD on July 12, 1982.

The item 'Other liabilities' includes among others (i) paid-up capital of Rs. 5 crores, (ii) reserve fund of Rs. 150 crores and (iii) National Industrial Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund of Rs. 4,175 crores. Liabilities on account of National Agricultural Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund and National Agricultural Credit (Stabilisation) Fund have been transferred to NABARD since its establishment on July 12, 1982.

For further details, reference may be made to 'Explanatory Notes on Current Statistics' issued as a Supplement to the R.B.I. Bulletin, October 1978.

#### Statement 33:

In terms of Government of India's notification No. 10(45)/82-AC(5) dated July 6, 1982, the loans and advances which the RBI granted to State Cooperative Banks and Regional Rural Banks under Section 17 (except Sub-clause (a) of clause (4) of RBI Act, 1934 and outstanding as on July 11, 1982 would be deemed to be loans and advances granted by NABARD under Section 21 of NABARD Act, 1981. With effect from the date of establishment of NABARD i.e., July 12, 1982, RBI doesn't grant loans and advances to state cooperative banks except (i) for the purposes of general banking business against the pledge of Government and other approved securities under Section 17(4) (a) of the RBI Act, 1934 and (ii) on behalf of urban co-operative banks under Section 17(2)(bb) of the RBI Act, 1934. Advances are made under various Sub-Sections of 21, 22 and 24 of the NABARD Act, 1981.

Details of the interest rates under different categories of financing according to purpose are given below:

1. Seasonal Agricultural Operations: at 2% below Bank Rate upto 1972-73. For 1973-74 and 1974-75, at ½% below Bank Rate subject to rebate of 1½% as per the Linking Scheme. From 1975-76 at 2% below Bank Rate subject to recovery of additional interest of 1½% as per Linking Scheme, excepting under Section 17(4)(a) of the RBI Act, for which the interest rate continued to be at 2% below Bank Rate. With effect from March 1, 1988, at 3% below Bank Rate subject to charging of additional interest of 1½% on borrowings in excess of 'aggregate level' as per the Linking Scheme.

Effective March 1, 1988 the rate of interest in relation to the availment of refinance by SCBs as a percentage of outstanding at CCB's level against PACS is as indicated below:-

- 2. Marketing of crops including cotton and kapas: at 2% below Bank Rate upto 1973-74 and at 3% above Bank Rate from 1974-75. With effect from June 1, 1978 at Bank Rate.
- 3. Purchase and distribution of chemical fertilisers: at Bank Rate upto 1971. For 1972 and 1973, at 2% above Bank Rate and 3% above Bank Rate from calendar year 1974. With effect from June 1, 1978, at 1% above Bank Rate.
- 4. (i) Financing weavers' co-operative societies: at 1½% below the Bank Rate upto February 28, 1978 and 2½% below the Bank Rate from March 1, 1978.
- (ii) Financing other industrial co-operative societies/units engaged in any one of the activities covered under the approved 22 broad groups of cottage and small scale industries: at Bank Rate upto 1976-77. At 1½% below Bank Rate with effect from July 1, 1977 and at 2½% below the Bank Rate with effect from March 1, 1978.
- (iii) Financing weavers and other rural artisans through Primary Agricultural Credit Societies/Farmers' Service Societies/Large sized Adivasi Multi-purpose Society/Societies: at 2% below Bank Rate upto February 28, 1978. At 3% below Bank Rate with effect from March 1, 1978.
- 5. Conversion of short-term into medium-term loans out of National Agricultural Credit (Stabilisation) Fund and medium-term loans for agricultural purposes: at 1½% below Bank Rate. With effect from March\_1, 1978 at 2½% below Bank Rate, and 3% below Bank Rate with effect from January 1, 1979.
  - 6. Long-term loans to State Governments for

From April 1, 1974, a uniform rate of 6% is charged on fresh loans.

With effect from the date of establishment of National Bank i.e., July 12, 1982, the Reserve Bank of India does not grant loans and advances to State Co-operative Banks, except (i) for the purpose for general banking business against the pledge of Government and other approved securities under section 17(4)(2) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 and (ii) on behalf of Urban Co-operative Banks under Section 17(2)(bb)/(4)(c) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934:

In terms of Government of India's notification No.10(45)/82-AC(5) dated July 6, 1982, loans and advances which the RBI granted to State Cooperative Banks and Regional Rural Banks under Section 17 [except sub-clause (a) of Clause (4)] of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 and outstanding as on July 11, 1982 would be deemed to be loans and advances granted by National Bank under section 21 of National Bank Act, 1981.

Though no new investment is now made by the Reserve Bank of India in the ordinary debentures of Land Development Banks, the investments made by the Bank in the past in those debentures, from out of the general resources of the Bank have not been transferred to National Bank and those investments continue to be held by the Bank. However, the investments made by the Bank, before setting up of National Bank, in the rural debentures of Land Development Bank have been transferred to National Bank, as those investments formed part of the assets of the then NAC(LTO) Fund.

#### Statement 34:

Consequent on the merger of the Refinance Corporation for Industry with Industrial Development Bank of India on September 1, 1964, the shares of the paid-up value of Rs. 100 lakhs, held by the Reserve Bank of India, have been paid for and taken up by the Industrial Development Bank of India.

Outstandings in respect of short-term finance to Industrial Finance Corporation under Section 17(4B) (a) and to Industrial Development Bank of India under Section 17 (4H)(a) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 are 'nil'.

Consequent upon the coming into force of the Public Financial Institutions Laws (Amendment) Act, 1975, share holding of the Reserve Bank of India in all the SFCs and IDBI have been transferred to and vested in IDBI and Government of India, respectively, from February 16, 1976.

The item 'Others' under Industrial Development Bank of India relates to long-term finance to IDBI from the NIC (LTO) Fund for purposes of purchase of or subscription to stocks, shares, bonds, debentures issued by IFCI, SFCs or any other notified financial institution or for purposes of any other business of IDBI.

Long-term finance to Export-Import Bank of India is given out of NIC (LTO) Fund for the purpose of any business of the Exim Bank.

Long-term finance to Industrial Reconstruction Bank of India is given out of NIC (LTO) Fund for the purpose of any business of I.R.B.I.

#### Statements 36 and 38:

Investments in other approved securities include investments in the (a) Securities of State associated bodies such as Electricity Board and Housing Board if the principal and interest on these securities are fully and unconditionally guaranteed by the respective State Governments, (b) Municipal Corporation Bonds issued in any Presidency town, (c) Debentures of Land Development Banks if the principal and interest thereon are fully and unconditionally guaranteed by the respective State Governments and (d) Shares of Regional Rural Banks. These are treated as approved securities under Section 5(a) of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

For details in respect of other items, reference may be made to 'Explanatory Notes on Current, Statistics' issued as a Supplement to the R.B.I. Bulletin, October 1978.

#### Statements 43 and 44:

Ownership holding referred to in the Statement relating to Primary Agricultural Credit Societies

(PACS) means the total land holding of a cultivator and not that part of a holding which is actually under cultivation or that which has been charged or mortgaged to the Society. Similarly, in the case of S.L.D.Bs and P.L.D.Bs., ownership holding refers to the total land holding of the concerned cultivator and not that part of holding which is actually mortgaged to the Primary/State Land Development Bank.

Agricultural labourers refer to those having a homestead and earning 50 per cent or more of their income from activities connected with agriculture including animal husbandry such as, dairy and poultry. This also includes other categories of members e.g., artisans, traders, etc.

#### Statement 45:

With the addition of 2 more RRBs in 1987, the total number of RRBs in the country now stands at 196; these banks cover 363 districts by a network of 13,353 branches as at the end of December 1987. The deposits of RRBs have grown by 33.45% over the preceding year and stood at Rs. 2,305.82 crores as on 31.12.1987 in 224.23 lakh accounts. The outstanding advances of RRBs increased by Rs. 447.42 crores during 1987 and stood at Rs. 2,232.26 crores as on 31.12.1987, showing 25% growth over 1986. During the calendar year 1987, the RRBs disbursed Rs. 823.86 crores to 29.67 lakh beneficiaries. The amount disbursed was 22.5% higher than the disbursements made in calendar year 1986. Of the amount disbursed, 36% or Rs. 297.16 crores was accounted for by Government sponsored programmes such as IRDP, DRI etc. The per account outstanding and disbursement at Rs. 2,390 and Rs. 2,776, respectively indicates a preponderence of small borrowers.

#### Statement 47:

The data cover the number and amount of cheques, drafts, bills, interest warrants, payment orders, etc., which pass through the clearing houses, including the documents returned unpaid. Data do not cover cheques cashed over the counter, out-station cheques collected directly without passing through the clearing houses and transfer transactions.

Figures in the column for 'Other Centres' and consequently for the column 'All Centres' are not

strictly comparable as the number of centres included under 'Other Centres' varies from time to time consequent upon the opening of new centres, etc.

#### Statement 49:

(a) The Reserve Bank of India Rate (Bank Rate) was raised from 5.00 per cent to 6.00 per cent on January 9, 1971, to 7.00 per cent from May 31, 1973, to 9.00 per cent from July 23, 1974 and to 10.00 per cent from July 11, 1981.

(b) (i) Treasury Bill rate of discount for sales on tap was raised from 3.00 per cent to 3.50 per cent from January 9, 1971, to 4.00 per cent from June 1, 1973, to 4.25 per cent from April 1, 1974 and to 4.60 per cent from July 23, 1974.

(ii) A scheme for 182 Days Treasury Bill was introduced initially on a monthly auction basis without any rediscounting facility with RBI. The first auction was held in November 1986.

#### (c) (1) Demand Loan Rate

#### (i) Scheduled Commercial Banks

Changed from 15.50 per cent to 15.00 per cent from March 1, 1978, from 15.00 per cent to 18.00 per cent from September 13, 1979, from 15.00—18.00 per cent to 16.15—19.40 per cent in July 1980 and from 16.15—19.40 per cent to 18.50 per cent from March 2, 1981 and to 18.00 per cent from April 1983 and to 17.50 per cent from April 1, 1985. All lending rates above 15 per cent reduced by one percentage point effective April 1, 1987. The new maximum lending rate is 16.50 per cent.

#### (ii) Co-operative Banks

From January 1966, the rate relates to call loans of Rs. 1 lakh and above; loans below Rs. 1 lakh are charged half a per cent less; changed from 14.50 per cent to 13.50 per cent from March 1, 1978; with effect from July 1, 1980, the rates charged on demand loans to co-operative banks are same as those applicable to general categories of borrowers for similar advances.

#### (2) Call Money Rates

(i) The call money rates are the weighted arithmetic averages of the rates at which money

is accepted and reported by selected scheduled commercial banks at Bombay, Calcutta and Madras, the weights being proportional to the amounts accepted during the period by the respective banks. Deposits requiring prior notice of any type for repayment are excluded.

(ii) As a follow-up of the Reserve Bank's decision to fix the maximum lending rate charged by commercial banks at 16.50 per cent effective March 15, 1976, the Indian Banks' Association issued a directive to its members asking them not to demand or pay more than 12.50 per cent per annum on any inter-bank borrowings with effect from March 29, 1976. Subsequently, in line with the changes made by the Reserve Bank in the interest rate structure of banks, the Indian Banks' Association revised the ceiling rate on inter-bank call money transactions from time to time as follows: (a) 12.50 per cent to 10.00 per cent with effect from June 15, 1977, (b) 10.00 per cent to 8.50 per cent with effect from March 9, 1978 and (c) 8.50 per cent to 10.00 per cent with effect from April 14, 1980.

#### (3) Discount Rate

Changed from 14.00—16.50 per cent to 14.00—16.00 per cent from May 16, 1975, from 14.00—16.00 per cent to 13.00—15.00 per cent from March 1, 1978, from 13.00—15.00 per cent to 18.00—19.50 per cent from June 1981, from 18.00—19.50 per cent to 17.50—18.00 per cent from April 1983, and to 17.00—17.50 per cent from April 1, 1985. Reduced from 17.50 to 15.50 per cent from April 1, 1987.

(d) Deposit rates were based on Inter-Bank Agreement upto September 1964 and on the Reserve Bank's directives thereafter. Deposit rates given here relate to (i) banks with demand and time liabilities (DTL) of Rs. 50 crores and above and foreign banks upto July 22, 1974, (ii) all banks between July 23, 1974 and end-January 1975 and (iii) banks with DTL of Rs. 25 crores and above from February 1, 1975.

(e) (i) The interest rate differential between FCNR Account Scheme and local deposits were gradually phased out in two stages (effective August 22, 1985 and February 10, 1986). Since May 5, 1986 the interest rates on FCNR and local deposits for maturities of 1 to 3 years are uniform. However, deposits for over 3 years are

not accepted under FCNR Scheme. Deposits under NRE Scheme continue to command the premium of 2 percentage points for maturities of one year and above, as hitherto. Effective September 8, 1986, interest rates on FCNR deposits for maturities of 1 to 3 years were reduced. With effect from May 25, 1987, interest rates on FCNR deposits with maturities of six months to 3 years were revised upwards. Effective October 12, 1987, interest rates on FCNR deposits with maturities of 6 months and above upto 3 years were revised upwards; these rates were reduced effective November 30, 1987 and reduced further effective February 8, 1988. Interest rates on FCNR deposits with maturity of 6 months to 2 years only were raised from May 23, 1988.

(ii) Scheduled commercial banks with DTL upto Rs. 50 crores were allowed to pay an additional interest of between 1/8 percentage point and 1/2 percentage point per annum on fixed deposits of all maturities upto July 22, 1974. This concession was withdrawn from July 23, 1974. From February 1, 1975, however, banks with DTL of less than Rs. 25 crores were allowed to pay 0.25 per cent higher on term-deposits with maturity of 5 years and less. From March 2, 1981, the higher rate was allowed to be paid only on term-deposits of less than 3 years maturity.

(iii) From October 2, 1975, the Regional Rural Banks (RRBs) were permitted to pay on deposits accepted by them, interest higher by 0.50 per cent per annum than those prescribed for specified categories of deposits for periods upto 5 years. This was further amended to cover deposits with a maturity of more than 5 years also effective January 1, 1977, but from June 1, 1977, RRBs were allowed to continue to pay 0.50 percentage point more on fixed deposits upto 5 years only. From March 2, 1981, the higher rate was allowed to be paid only on term-deposits of less than 3 years maturity.

(iv) Central co-operative banks and primary (urban) co-operative banks are allowed to pay, at their discretion, on fixed deposits additional interest of 0.50 per cent and 1.00 per cent, respectively. As regards State co-operative banks, while earlier all of them were allowed to pay 0.25 per cent more, from September 13, 1979, State co-operative banks in the Union Territories and in Tripura, Nagaland and Meghalaya are allowed to

pay 0.50 per cent more, while other banks are allowed to continue to pay 0.25 per cent more than the interest rate payable by commercial banks.

(f) A ceiling of 9.00 per cent was imposed on the lending rates of the Indian scheduled banks with aggregate DTL of Rs. 50 crores or above and all the foreign scheduled banks with effect from September 25, 1964; the rate was raised to 10.00 per cent from February 17, 1965, but reduced to 9.50 per cent from March 2, 1968. Since January 21, 1970, the ceiling on lending rates was withdrawn.

(g) With effect from March 15, 1976, the Bank had fixed the maximum lending rate to be charged by scheduled commercial banks, having DTL of Rs. 50 crores and over at 16.50 per cent. Banks with DTL of Rs. 25 crores and above but less than Rs. 50 crores were allowed to charge one percentage point higher (i.e., 17.50 per cent) than the ceiling rate of interest. The rate was inclusive of the 7 per cent levy on interest income from advances. The ceiling rate was not applicable in the case of banks with DTL of less than Rs. 25 crores. With the abolition of the tax of 7 per cent on interest income earned by banks, the maximum lending rate chargeable by banks was reduced to 15.00 per cent for banks with DTL of Rs. 25 crores and over and was fixed at 16.00 per cent for banks with DTL of less than Rs. 25 crores with effect from March 1, 1978. Effective September 13, 1979, the maximum lending rate on short-term advances was raised from 15.00 per cent to 18.00 per cent in respect of banks with DTL of Rs. 25 crores and above and from 16.00 per cent to 19.00 per cent in respect of banks with DTL below Rs. 25 crores. Certain categories of advances e.g., advances to priority sectors, export credit, credit to sick units, credit to Food Corporation of India, etc. were exempted from the increase in lending rates.

Consequent to the reimposition of the tax of 7 per cent on interest income of banks in 1980, the maximum lending rate inclusive of interest tax chargeable by banks was enhanced from July 1, 1980, from 18.00 per cent to 19.40 per cent in respect of banks with DTL of Rs. 25 crores and above and from 19.00 per cent to 20.50 per cent in respect of banks with DTL below Rs. 25 crores. Effective March 2, 1981, distinction among banks on the basis of DTL was abolished and a com-

mon ceiling rate of 19.50 per cent was introduced.

(h) In the revised interest rates structure which became effective from March 2, 1981, no general minimum lending rate was fixed but a broad framework of interest rates was provided with fixed rates on certain types of advances and ceiling rates on other types of advances. Wherever ceiling rates were prescribed, the rate of interest fixed for the preceding advance would serve as floor rate for advances in that category.

#### Statement 52:

The Government of India cancelled its credit guarantee scheme for small-scale industries as at the close of business on 31st March 1981 and the Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee Corporation (DICGC) acting as agent of the Government, in the place of the Credit Guarantee Organisation, exercises the rights and discharges the obligations of the Government arising out of or accruing under that scheme upto the date of its cancellation. Accordingly, all credit facilities covered under that scheme and in respect of which a default had occurred prior to its cancellation will continue to be covered under that scheme. All claims pending as on the date of cancellation as also those preferred subsequently in respect of such defaulted accounts are to be first met by the Corporation and reimbursement obtained from the Government periodically.

The credit institutions have been asked to furnish a complete list of all advances in default as on March 31, 1981, which continued to be the liability of the Government of India. However, the information received so far, from participating institutions shows the accounts in default as on March 31, 1981 at Rs. 233.71 crores. (This information, however, is incomplete as over 2,812 branches of credit institutions have yet to report the figures). These advances as stated earlier, will continue to be governed under the terms and conditions of the Government's Scheme (since cancelled) and guarantees can be invoked in respect of them.

In view of the cancellation of the Government's Scheme and to provide continuity of cover to advances previously covered by the cancelled scheme but not in default on March 31, 1981 and also to provide guarantee cover to fresh credit facilities

sanctioned to small-scale industrial units, the DICGC introduced its own guarantee scheme called Small Loans (SSI) Guarantee Scheme, 1981 with effect from April 1, 1981.

The number of participating credit institutions under the corporation's new scheme was 510 as on 31st December 1987. The guaranteed advances to small-scale industries as on June 30, 1987 amounted to Rs. 7,738.03 crores which showed an increase of Rs. 240.57 crores as compared to the guaranteed advances of Rs. 7,497.46 crores as at the end of June 1986.

As on the date of cancellation of the scheme, claims amounting to Rs. 98.18 crores were pending with the erstwhile Credit Guarantee Organisation, and were transferred to the DICGC for disposal. During the year 1986, 4,870 claims for an amount of Rs. 17.39 crores were received (in respect of accounts in default upto March 31, 1981) while 5,601 claims for Rs. 33.81 crores were disposed of. As on December 31, 1987, 1,302 claims amounting to Rs. 18.91 crores were pending.

#### Statement 54:

Debt: Comprises (1) all borrowings from Government and semi-Government, financial institutions other than banks and other institutional agencies, (2) borrowings from banks against own debentures and other mortgages and (3) 'other borrowings' against own debentures, other mortgages, deferred payment liabilities and public and other deposits.

Equity: Comprises paid-up capital (ordinary, preference, deferred, etc. shares), for feited shares and all reserves.

Current assets: Comprise (1) inventories, (2) loans and advances and other debtor balances, (3) book value of quoted investments, (4) cash and bank balances and (5) advance of income-tax in excess of tax provision.

Current liabilities: Comprise (1) tax provision in excess of advance of income-tax and other current provisions, (2) borrowings from banks other than those against own debentures and other mortgages, (3) 'other borrowings' other than (i) those against own debentures, other mortgages, deferred payment liabilities and (ii) public

and other deposits and (4) trade dues and other current liabilities.

#### Statement 64:

IDBI data exclude refinance to SFCs and SIDCs, subscriptions to shares and bonds of financial institutions and Seed Capital assistance through SFCs and SIDCs which are shown within brackets to avoid double counting.

ICICI figures include sanctions under suppliers' credit (Rs. 146.55 crores in 1986-87 and Rs. 163.40 crores in 1987-88), leasing (Rs. 91.83 crores in 1986-87 and Rs. 121.34 crores in 1987-88) and venture capital (Rs. 0.9 crore in 1986-87 and Rs. 3.92 crores in 1987-88).

ICICI figures include disbursements under suppliers' credit (Rs. 85.79 crores in 1986-87 and Rs. 69.82 crores in 1987-88), leasing (Rs. 47.14 crores in 1986-87 and Rs. 63.96 crores in 1987-88) and venture capital (Rs. 2.97 crores in 1987-88).

IRBI figures include sanctions under equipment leasing (Rs. 0.12 crore in 1986-87 and Rs. 2.13 crores in 1987-88), hire-purchase (Rs. 0.77 crore

in 1986-87 and Rs. 1.55 crores in 1987-88), sanctions to Textile Processing Corporation of India (Rs. 0.26 crore in 1986-87 and Rs. 0.37 crore in 1987-88) and lines of credit to state level institutions (Rs. 2.5 crores in 1987-88).

IRBI figures include disbursements under equipment leasing (Rs. 0.01 crore in 1986-87 and Rs. 0.16 crore in 1987-88), hire-purchase (Rs. 0.17 crore in 1986-87 and Rs. 0.41 crore in 1987-88), disbursements to Textile Processing Corporation of India (Rs. 0.44 crore in 1986-87 and Rs. 0.19 crore in 1987-88) and lines of credit to state-level institutions (Rs. 0.32 crore in 1986-87 and Rs. 1.09 crores in 1987-88).

LIC figures include resources support to other financial institutions (Rs. 141.00 crores in 1986-87 and Rs. 161.36 crores in 1987-88).

#### Statement 68:

Unit Scheme, 1964 introduced on 1st July 1964, includes units sold under (i) Reinvestment Plan, 1966, (ii) Voluntary Savings Plan, 1969 upto 1973-74 and (iii) Children's Gift Plan, 1970, including fractional units allotted by reinvestment of dividend under Children's Gift Plan, 1970 which was terminated from July 1, 1986.

Amounts in respect of units sold under the Unit Scheme, 1971, introduced on October 1, 1971, relate to initial contributions, renewal contributions and income distribution.

Unit Scheme, 1976 (Capital Units) was introduced on January 1, 1976. Sale of units under this Scheme remains suspended with effect from April 22, 1976. The Scheme was terminated on June 30, 1981.

Unit Scheme, 1981 (CRTS-81), introduced on Oct. 1, 1981 is for Charitable and Religious Trusts and Registered Societies. Repurchases under the Scheme are allowed only after the completion of the participation in the scheme for a period of 3 years.

Under the Income Unit Scheme, 1982 (IUS-82), the units were sold during May and June 1982. The Scheme was terminated on July 1, 1987 and an option for conversion was offered to the unit holders as on June 30, 1987 to convert their holdings to GIUS-87(II).

Under the Monthly Income Unit Scheme, 1983 (MIS-83), the units were sold during March and April 1983. Repurchases under the Scheme were allowed from July 1, 1986.

Under Growth and Income Unit Scheme, 1983 (GIS-83), the units were sold during May and June 1983. Repurchases are allowed between October 1, to April 30, of every year.

Under the Monthly Income Unit Scheme (2), 1983 (MIS(2)-83), units were sold during November and December 1983. Repurchases under the Scheme were allowed from January 1, 1987.

Capital Gains Unit Scheme, 1983 (CGS-83), was introduced on December 1, 1983. Repurchases will be allowed only after a period of holding investment for three years under this Scheme. It is an open-end Scheme.

Under the Monthly Income Unit Scheme (3), 1984 (MIS(3)-84), units were sold during September and October 1984. Repurchases under the Scheme were allowed from 1st November 1987.

Under Income Unit Scheme, 1985 (IUS-85), the units were sold during January and February 1985. Repurchases under the Scheme are allowed from 1st January 1988.

Under the Monthly Income Unit Scheme (4), 1985 (MIS(4)-85), units were sold during March and April 1985. Repurchases under the Scheme are allowed from 1st May 1988.

Under Monthly Income Unit Scheme (5), 1985 (MIS(5)-85), units were sold during September and October 1985. Repurchases under the Scheme are allowed from 1st November 1988.

Under Growing Income Unit Scheme, 1986 (GIUS-86), the units were sold during December 1985 and January 1986. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from February 1, 1989.

Under Monthly Income Unit Scheme with Growth (6), 1986 (MISG(6)-86), units were sold during April and May 1986. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from 1st July 1989.

Under Children's Gift Growth Fund Unit

Scheme, 1986 (CGGF-86), children below the age of 15 years are allowed to join. This open-ended Scheme was introduced on April 14, 1986.

Under India Fund Unit Scheme, 1986 (IFUS-1986), units were sold to Non-resident Indians and individual residents outside India from July 10, 1986 to August 15, 1986.

Under Mutual Fund Unit Scheme, 1986 (MFUS-1986), units were sold to Indian residents from September 19, 1986 to October 18, 1986.

Under Monthly Income Unit Scheme with Extra Growth (7)/1986 (MISG(7)-86), units were sold during October, November and upto December 15, 1986. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from December 15, 1989.

Under Growing Income Unit Scheme 1987, (GIUS-1987), the units were sold during January and February, 1987. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from March 1, 1990.

Under Monthly Income Unit Scheme with Extra Bonus and Growth, 1987 (MISG(8)-87), the units were sold during April and May 1987. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from July 1, 1990. An option was offered to the unit holders under the series MIS(1) to (5) to convert their holdings to MISG(8)-87.

Under Growing Income Unit Scheme (Cumulative and Non-cumulative) 1987(II), (GIUS '87(II)), the option for conversion of units from Income Unit Scheme 1982 was offered during June 1987. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from 1st July 1990.

Under Growing Income Unit Scheme '87(III) (GJUS'87(III)), the units were sold during the months of September and October 1987. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from 1st November 1990.

Under Monthly Income Unit Scheme with Extra Bonus plus Growth (9), 1987 (MISG-(9)-87), the units were sold during November and December 1987. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from 1st January, 1991.

Under Parents' Gift and Growth Fund Unit Scheme 1987, PGGF-87, the Units are sold throughout the year. This scheme was introduced on December 15, 1987. The Scheme operates in two stages.

- A— Compound Growth of Units invested at 12.5% per annum on half-yearly basis for a period of 4 or 5 years.
- B— The accumulated amount after 4-5 years will be reinvested in the nearest Monthly Income Unit Scheme (MIS) for the next five years, thereby enabling the beneficiaries to derive Monthly Income from their investment.

Under Monthly Income Unit Scheme with Extra Bonus plus Growth (10) 1988 (MISG-(10)-88), units were sold during the months of April and May 1988. Repurchases under the Scheme will be allowed from 1st July 1991.

#### Statements 80 to 82:

The receipts and disbursements given in these statements differ from the figures shown in the Annual Financial Statement (Budget of the Central Government) mainly because in these statements data on revenue account exclude figures relating to Posts and Telegraphs Department, Railways and States' share of the Union excise duties. Defence expenditure is shown on a net basis under revenue expenditure. In Capital Account, receipts are shown on net basis. The total Capital Receipts in this Report differ from those in earlier Reports, since these are net of repayment of debt. Net variation in Treasury Bills is treated as financing item of surplus/deficit.

The figures for Revenue and Capital Accounts given in these statements are not comparable with those given in the Reports on Currency and Finance prior to 1973-74 due to changes in the accounting classification of the Budget. For a brief discussion on the new classification, please refer to Chapter V on 'Budgets and Public Debt' of the Report on Currency and Finance, 1973-74.

The figures from 1985-86 onwards are not comparable with those of earlier years due to changes in accounting classification of the Budget mainly due to (1) exclusion of Loans against Small Savings collections and Ways and Means Advances and (2) securities issued in favour of IMF whereas Receipts and Expenditures of Commercial Departments are included as per the earlier years.

#### Statement 82:

Data from 1974-75 onwards cover expenditure on food subsidy under the head 'agriculture and allied services' as part of economic services and relief on account of natural calamities as part of 'social and community services' under developmental expenditure; in earlier years, data on the expenditure on these items were included under the head 'other expenditure' as part of non-developmental expenditure.

#### Statement 91:

The statement is prepared from the data given in the Finance Accounts of the Union Government and the Receipts Budget of the Central Government. In the Memoranda on certain items like capital outlay on important departmental undertakings and investment in major autonomous corporations were separately shown and data on External Debt were separately shown and data on External Debt were shown country-wise and institution-wise. From 1976-77 onwards, these items are clubbed together and not shown separately by corporation/institution/country division. Consequent modifications have been made in this Statement beginning with the Report on Currency and Finance, 1975-76.

#### Statements 94 and 95:

The statements exclude:

(i) The National Defence Gold Bonds, 1980 (A and B series) which were on sale between October 1965 and May 1966. The contributions in gold to these bonds were 82,35,260 grams and 47,57,709 grams for A and B series, respectively. The value of such bonds amounted to Rs. 4,41 lakhs and Rs. 2,55 lakhs, respectively, at the rate of Rs. 53.58 per 10 grams. The date of redemption of these bonds was October 27, 1980. After repayment, the balances as on 31st March 1988 were Rs. 32.41 lakhs and Rs. 15.55 lakhs for A and B series, respectively.

(ii) 4½% Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds, 1979, 5½% Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds, 1999, 4½% Jayanti Shipping Company (Acquisition of Shares) Compensation Bonds, 1981 and 5¾% Bonds, 1985 (Voluntary Disclosure of

Income and Wealth Ordinance, 1975, now Voluntary Disclosure of Income and Wealth Act, 1976).

(iii) Issue and repayment of various State Government's Zamindari Abolition and Compensation Bonds which amounted to Rs. 1,34 lakhs and Rs. 38 lakhs, respectively during 1987-88. At the end of the period, the balance outstanding was Rs. 89,56 lakhs.

(iv) Repayments of Small Savings Certificates, etc., during 1987-88 amounted to Rs. 9 lakhs and outstandings amounted to Rs. 8,50 lakhs as at the end of the period.

#### Statement 97:

Debt of State Governments which used to be shown as per the old classification under the following heads: (i) Permanent Debt, (ii) Floating Debt, (iii) Loans from the Centre, (iv) Other Debt and (v) Unfunded Debt has been reclassified from the year ended March 1973 onwards as recommended in the Second Report of the Team of Reforms, in the Structure of Budget and Accounts. Outstanding debt liabilities for the years subsequent to March 31, 1972, are, therefore, not strictly comparable, item by item, with those for the earlier years. Under the new classification, the major heads are (i) Internal Debt comprising of (a) Market Loans and Bonds, (b) Ways and Means Advances from the Reserve Bank of India and (c) Loans from Banks and Other Institutions, (ii) Loans and Advances from the Central Government and (iii) Provident Funds, etc.

#### (i) Internal Debt:

(a) Market Loans and Bonds: This item is identical with the item 'Permanent Debt' in the old classification and comprises current and expired loans floated in the market and compensation bonds issued in connection with abolition of Zamindari and Jagirdari and Housing Bonds etc.

(b) Ways and Means Advances from the Reserve Bank of India: This item corresponds to 'Floating Debt' of the earlier classification except for the exclusion now of cash credits from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks and represents in the new classification ways and means advances and overdrafts (repayable within seven days) from the Reserve Bank of India.

Figures in the Statement against this item prior to March 31, 1973 represent outstanding 'Floating Debt' of the old classification.

- (c) Loans from Banks and Other Institutions: This item corresponds to 'Other Debt' of the earlier classification, but now includes cash credits from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks, National Rural Credit (Longterm Operation) Fund of the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development, National Co-operative Development Corporation, Life Insurance Corporation of India, Employees' State Insurance Corporation, Khadi and Village Industries Commission and others. Figures against this item prior to March 31, 1973 represent outstanding 'Other Debt' under the old classification.
- (ii) Loans and advances from the Central Government: This item is identical with 'Loans from the Centre' in the earlier classification and comprises loans and advances from the Central Government for Plan as well as non-Plan purposes including loans against Small Savings collections.
- (iii) Provident Funds etc.: This item is identical with 'Unfunded Debt' in the old classification and includes State Provident Funds, Insurance and Pension Funds, Trusts and Endowments.

#### Statement 99:

The statement on Government of India Loans also includes (i) Hyderabad Loans upto 1974, (ii) 7% Gold Bonds, 1980, upto 1979, (iii) National Defence Gold Bonds, 1980 (A and B Series) issued between October 1965 and May 1966, in the form of Gold upto 1980, (iv) 4½ % Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds, 1979, upto 1979, (v) 5½ % Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds, 1999, (vi) 41/2 % Jayanti Shipping Company (Acquisition of Shares) Compensation Bonds, 1981 and (vii) 534% Bonds, 1985, (Voluntary Disclosure of Income and Wealth Ordinance, 1975, now Voluntary Disclosure of Income and Wealth Act, 1976). Special Bearer Bonds issued on February 2, 1981 are not covered.

#### Statement 100:

Details of limits of investment and rate of

interest on different Current Small Savings Media are given below:

- 1. Post Office Savings Bank: Minimum of Rs. 20, maximum of Rs. 50,000 for an individual and Rs. 1,00,000 for two or three adults jointly, in one or more accounts at 5½% (Tax free) compounded and payable annually by credit to the account with effect from February 1, 1987. Accounts having minimum balance of Rs. 200 during April-September and October-March qualify for six-monthly prize draws in the next January and July.
- 2. 7-Year National Savings Certificates II Issue: Maximum Rs. 75,000 for an individual and Rs. 1,50,000 for two adults jointly. Limits inclusive of holdings in the N.S.Cs.III Issue, compound interest at the rate of 6½% (Tax free) at maturity (Rs. 100 become Rs. 165.50 including bonus of Rs. 10 after 7 years).
- 3. Public Provident Fund Accounts: Minimum Rs. 100 and maximum Rs. 60,000 in every fiscal year (minimum period 15 years). Individuals and H.U.F. can subscribe. Current interest rate 12% compound, to be credited to the account at the end of every financial year, payable at the time of final withdrawal. The scheme has been modified to permit one withdrawal every year between 6th and 15th year of an amount not exceeding 50 per cent of the balance to the credit of a member at the end of the fourth financial year immediately preceding the year of withdrawal or at the end of the preceding year whichever is lower, less the amount of loan, if any, provided that not more than one withdrawal shall be permissible during any one financial year. A subscriber may, on expiry of 15 years from the end of the year in which the initial subscription was made and in case he does not intend to close the account immediately, inform the accounts office that
  - a) he would continue to subscribe for a further block period of 5 years or
  - b) he would not make any further subscriptions.

In the event of a subscriber desiring to subscribe during the aforesaid block period, he would be eligible to make one partial withdrawal, at any time during that period, equal to 50 per cent of the balance at his credit at the commencement of the block period. Where, however, the

subscriber does not wish to make any further subscription, the balance at his credit shall continue to earn interest until he applies to the accounts office for the withdrawal of the entire balance standing to his credit. An employee who is already contributing to Provident Fund as per his service conditions, can also simultaneously contribute to the Public Provident Fund. The condition of at least six months' holding from the valuation date, does not apply to the Public Provident Fund.

- 4. 6-Year National Savings Certificates VI Issue: In denominations of Rs. 50, Rs. 100, Rs. 500, Rs. 1,000, Rs. 5,000 and Rs. 10,000 (without limit). The sale of Rs. 10 denomination has been discoutinued with effect from April 1, 1986. Interest at 11.00% compounded (half yearly) and payable on maturity, Rs. 100 become Rs. 190.10. Annual accrual of interest allowable for tax purpose. Accrued interest on NSC VI issue eligible for deduction under Section 80C of Income Tax Act. An individual and H.U.F. can subscribe in the name of any member of the family.
- 5. 6-Year National Savings Certificates VII Issue: In denominations of Rs. 100, Rs. 500, Rs. 1,000, Rs. 5,000 and Rs. 10,000 (without limit). Interest at 11% payable half-yearly with effect from April 1987—An individual and H.U.F. can subscribe in the name of any member of the family.
- 6. 10-Year Social Security Certificates: An individual between age of 18 and 45 years can invest upto Rs. 5,000 in denominations of Rs. 500 and Rs. 1,000; Rs. 1,000 become Rs. 3,000 on maturity. Interest at the rate of 11.30% compounded half-yearly. Annual accrual of interest allowable for tax purposes. Encashable prematurely after 3 years and rate of interest in such cases would be 5.5% per annum. If the holder dies due to any cause after 2 years from the date of purchase of Certificates, nominee or legal heir will get full maturity value immediately. This benefit will also be available if the holder dies within first two years due to non-natural cause excluding suicide that he is in good health and during last 3 years he has not suffered from any specified disease or undergone any surgical operations requiring hospitalisation for more than 10 days.

- 7. Post Office Time Deposit Accounts: In multiples of Rs. 50 (without limit). Interest at 9.5% for 1 year account, 10.0% for 2 years account, 10.5% for 3 years account, 11.0% for 5 years account with effect from April 1, 1987. Interest payable annually calculated at half yearly rest
- 8. Post Office Recurring Deposit Accounts (Period 5 years): In multiples of Rs. 5 per month subject to a minimum of ten rupees (without limit). Advance deposits allowed. Interest at 11.0% compound and payable at maturity (i.e., after 5 years). An account of Rs. 10 denomination will yield Rs. 797.10 on maturity with effect from April 1987.
- 9. Indira Vikas Patras (IVP): Introduced with effect from November 19, 1986 with a maturity period of 5 years in the denomination of Rs. 500, Rs. 1,000 and Rs. 5,000. The investors at the time of purchase are required to pay only half of the denomination value of the IVP. The maturity period of IVP was increased to five and half years effective April 1, 1987 to bring down the effective rate from 14.87 per cent to 13.43 per cent. The budget for 1988-89, has, however, once again restored the maturity period to five years on IVP sold from March 1, 1988.
- 10. National Savings Scheme: Minimum of Rs. 100 and maximum of Rs. 30,000 can be deposited with effect from assessment year 1989-90. The rate of interest payable is 11.0 per cent. Interest is calculated on the balance on the first of each month and credited on the 1st April for the previous year. The account can be closed after expiry of 3 financial years from the end of the year in which the last deposit was made.
- 11. 6-Year Post Office Monthly Income Account Scheme: Minimum of Rs. 5,000 and in multiples thereof subject to a maximum of Rs. 1,00,000. Interest will be paid monthly at the rate of 12% per annum i.e. Rs. 50 will be paid every month on a deposit of Rs. 5,000 and Rs. 100 will be paid every month on a deposit of Rs. 10,000.
- 12. 9% Relief Bonds, 1987: Introduced with effect from Dec. 1, 1987, with a maturity period of 5 years. Interest at 9.0% and payable annually. This scheme is open to individuals, H.U.Fs. and Non-Resident Indians. Gift of the Bonds made

by an initial subscriber is exempt from gift tax subject to a maximum of Rs. 5 lakhs in value in aggregate in one or more years.

13. Kisan Vikas Patra: Introduced with effect from April 1, 1988, encashable after  $5\frac{1}{2}$  years. Interest at 13.43% compound and payable at maturity (i.e., after  $5\frac{1}{2}$  years). This scheme is without tax concession, but with flexibility of encashment after two and half years of deposit.

#### Statements 104 to 110:

The foreign trade data relate to total sea, air and land trade, on private and Government accounts. With effect from April 1963, trade of Goa, Daman and Diu as well as Andaman and Nicobar Islands, land-borne trade in Nepal and exports by parcel-post of pearls and precious stones are included. Direct transit trade, transhipment trade, ships' stores and passengers' baggage are excluded. Data include silver (other than current coins), notes and coins withdrawn from circulation or not vet issued, indirect transit trade and trade by parcel post. Exports include reexports and exports by letter-post. Imports include dutiable articles by letter-post but exclude certain consignments of foodgrains and stores on Government account awaiting adjustment and defence stores from October 1979. Imports and exports are based on general system of recording; imports are on c.i.f. basis and exports on f.o.b. basis inclusive of export duty. The exports figures for the period of November 1970 to March 1973 are based on original copy of the shipping bills and for the rest of the period, they are based on the finally passed shipping bills.

Total figures shown in Statements 104 to 106 and 109 take into account recent revisions for which detailed break-up are not available. Revisions in the total figures are carried out by D.G.C.I. & S. as and when further details become available. Commodity-wise totals in Statement 110 may not tally with corresponding figures in statement 105 due to different category classification.

In Statement 105, the break-up of the items, essential oils and perfume materials: toilet polishing and cleansing materials have been included under Chemicals. Crude oil and petroleum products are shown under Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and Related Materials. In Statement 106, an item 'Vegetable oils, fixed (edible

oils)' is introduced under the major commodity group 'Animal and vegetable oils, Fats and Waxes'. In Statement 110, the item Jute hessian, Jute carpet backing and Jute sacking have been clubbed under item 'Jute manufactures'. For the items, viz., (1) Chemicals—total—of which (a) Dyeing, tanning and colouring materials and (b) Essential oils and perfume materials, toilet polishing and cleansing preparations, (2) Apparels, (3) Machinery (electrical and non-electrical), (4) Transport equipment and (5) Jute manufactures, data are given only for five years.

The D.G.C.I & S. have covered additional items in the statement of Index Nos. for foreign trade of India. Accordingly, Statement No. 107 covers 38 items and Statement No. 108, 42 items instead of 24 items earlier.

#### Statement 119:

India's official foreign exchange reserves comprise holdings of foreign currencies, gold and Special Drawing Rights (SDRs). These are given in rupees, the method of valuation being as indicated in the footnote to the Statement. SDR holdings are, however, given in units of SDR also. As on March 31, 1971, one SDR was equal to one U.S. dollar. Effective July 1, 1974, the value of SDR was determined daily by the Fund on the basis of a basket of 16 currencies. Beginning July 1978, the composition of the basket of currencies and the weight assigned to each currency was changed, though the number of currencies in the revised basket was retained at 16. Since January 1, 1981, the SDR valuation basket consists of the currencies of the five member countries having the largest exports of goods and services during 1975-79, i.e. U.S. dollar, Deutsche mark, French franc, Japanese yen and Pound sterling.

As on end-March 1988, one SDR was equivalent to U.S. \$ 1.38729, the average for the month being U.S. \$ 1.37141. As at end-June 1988, the rate was U.S. \$ 1.31061 per SDR with the average for the month at U.S. \$ 1.34654.

#### Statement 127:

The amount paid during the year is inclusive of payments made on half value of notes of denominations Rs. 10 and above.

#### Statement 129:

The Reserve Bank of India maintains currency chests/ sub-chests and small coin depots/sub-depots, not only with the State Bank of India and Associates and 20 Nationalised banks but also with treasuries and sub-treasuries. Currency chests/small coin depots have also been established with a few branches of the Jammu and Kashmir Bank Ltd.

#### Statement 132:

From 1970-71 to 1974-75, the figures are inclusive of gold from following gold accounts: Surplus Gold Stock Account, gold held at I.M.F. rate (confiscated gold received from State Governments, etc.), confiscated gold received from Customs and Central Excise authorities, National Defence Fund Gold Stock Account, Indian (Bharat) Mines Gold Stock Account, Reserve Bank of India (Issue Department) Gold Stock Account, gold received from the Hutti Gold Mines Co. Ltd. and gold received from public for refining. For 1975-76, data pertain to Surplus Gold Stock (Amalgamated) Account, Confiscated Gold Stock Account (received from

Customs and Central Excise authorities), Reserve Bank of India (Issue Department) Gold Stock Account, gold received from the Hutti Gold Mines Co. Ltd. and public for refining. From 1976-77 onwards, the quantity shown under gold pertains to Surplus Gold Stock (Amalgamated) Account, Confiscated Gold Stock Account (received from Customs and Central Excise authorities), gold received from the Hutti Gold Mines Co. Ltd. and public for refining. From 1986-87 onwards, the quantity shown under gold pertains to Surplus Gold Stock (Amalgamated) Account. Confiscated Gold Stock Account (received from collectorate of Central Excise and Customs), gold received from the Hutti Gold Mines Co. Ltd., S.B.I. (Imported), public and Collection-cum-Delivery Centre, Ahmedabad for refining.

The figures of silver melting and assaying are inclusive of silver from Surplus Silver Stock Account, confiscated silver received from the Customs and Central Excise authorities, silver received from State Governments and Judicial authorities, silver pertaining to the National Defence Fund and silver received from private parties, etc.
